### Petts Wood and Knoll is No1. for Green Garden waste recycling

Figures recently released by Bromley Council show that more people in Petts Wood and Knoll ward have taken up the **green garden waste bins** than any other ward in the whole of Bromley.

"It is really great that so many residents have taken up this service" said **Simon**. "When I speak with resident they are all determined to do their bit to reduce waste and recycle where they can."

With this very positive outlook from residents Bromley Council should be able to meet their target of net zero for direct activities by 2029.

### Street Light Upgrades Coming Your Way

As part of Bromley Council's efficiency measures and programme to reduce carbon emissions, the following streets are now earmarked for street light upgrades to LED lamp columns and lighting in the near future. **Augustus Lane, Badgers Copse, Brookside, Corn Mill Drive, Hillview Road, Irene Road, Lynwood Grove, Maybury Close, Oatfield Road, St John's Road, Stanley Road, Tower Close, Towncourt Lane and Tudor Way.**

"These changes will save the Council £180,000.00 per annum and provide residents with a more reliable service" said **Tony**.

In addition the heritage lamps in **The Chenies, Beckford Drive** and in the **Orpington High Street** Conservation Area will be retro-fitted with LED lighting.

## Petts Wood & Knoll Just Got Bigger

As a result of the recent Local Government Boundary changes, Petts Wood & Knoll ward has increased in size with the new boundaries.

We would like to welcome residents in the following areas:-

**From Crofton:** Ainsdale Close, Beckford Drive, Birkdale Close, Crofton Lane (Even Numbers), Cromer Place, Ferndown Avenue, Gleneagles Close, Kingswood Close, Lewing Close, Oakmont Place, Pickering Lane, Pinehurst Walk, Place Farm Avenue, Springfield Walk, Squirrel Close, Tandridge Drive, Tandridge Place, Turnberry Way and Woodcote Drive.

**From the Knoll:** Augustus Lane, Badgers Copse, Hill End, the bottom of Knoll Rise, Orchard Grove, St. Aubyns Gardens, St. Aubyns Close, Station Road, Station Approach, The Drive, The Avenue, The Approach, Tower Road, Tower Close, and Vinson Close.

**From Petts Wood:** Chesham Avenue (low numbers). Chislehurst Road (Even numbers only), Grosvenor Road and Scotsdale Close.

One of the benefits to the new boundaries is the prospect that Crofton Infants School will no longer have to close on election day, allowing residents to vote at the Crofton Baptist Church instead. "This will be great for many parents and children that were inconvenienced when the school closed to become a polling station" said **Keith**.

These boundary changes will come into effect for the Bromley Council elections that take place on 5th May 2022. In the meanwhile, nothing will change with regard to your current Councillors, though **Simon, Keith, and Tony** are more than happy to pass on any queries you may have before the elections when the changes take effect.

**Simon, Keith, and Tony** have been selected by the Conservative Party to fight the revised Petts Wood & Knoll Ward in May 2022.
